

Dallas Stout Accepts Appointment to Teach at UC Irvine

Dallas Stout, Psy.D., has accepted an appointment to teach a class on adolescents, "Adolescent Development in Education" (EDUC 108), at University of California, Irvine in their School of Education beginning next month. He has taught a popular course on adolescents for the Department of Child and Adolescent Studies at California State University, Fullerton for seven years. Stout is also on the faculty at University of the Rockies.

Stout has worked in the non-profit community in Southern California for more than 20 years, including many years leading Orange County's largest adolescent residential drug rehab and high school. He has volunteered on the board of directors and advisory boards for a variety of local, countywide and statewide programs for troubled youth and related issues.

Today when he is not teaching at the university, he uses his experience to assist a variety of non-profit programs in Southern California thru DoctorS Nonprofit Consulting, which he founded with his wife, Debra Stout, Psy.D., in 2004.
